Village of Kimberly Grease Trap Inspections Summary Report June 30, 2015

FOG Control Program Update

We have prepared some samples of informational signs that can be placed in park shelters asking users not to put grease down the drains. The content and placement of the signs will be discussed at the July Commission meeting.

At the June Commission meeting, the guidelines for televising sanitary sewer lines and laterals were approved. Within the guidelines are requirements for submitting a summary report, by each community, of their manhole and sewer inspection findings every 6 months, as they relate to the observation and removal of grease in the sewer and manholes.

Each Community is asked to define the limits in which sewer televising may take place, in regards to televising private laterals from the main sewer and without the property owner's permission.

Summary of Site Visits and Correspondence:

Hitters: We have made numerous attempts to contact the owner of Hitters Bar to check on the progress of their grease trap installation. On June 30, 2015 we sent him a letter indicating that he was non-compliant with our FOG Control Program. We will discuss possible remedies for non-compliant users at the July Commission meeting.

Sites Requiring Grease Traps:

The two remaining sites have retained plumbers and are awaiting plan approval or plumber availability to complete the project.
