Going forward, the District hopes to hold annual April meeting with the Communities to facilitate discussion between the HOVMSD Commission and Staff, and with the member Communities. The intent is for information exchange among all attendees on any matters effecting, or in common, with each other.

At the March 8, 2016 Commission meeting the draft report on sustainability of the system was presented to the District Commissioners by Donohue Associates. The report indicated progress from nearly all Communities. We felt it would be good to present the final report to all Communities at a joint meeting. Administrators, Trustees, Council members, DPW staffs, and Engineering Departments from all member Communities have been invited. The report intent is to show the Communities how their system is performing based upon the monitoring being performed, and the progress that is being made.

No new directives to the member Communities are being considered at this time, but we do want to encourage continued efforts toward sustainability of the collection system and treatment plant.

Feel free to check with Bruce as to his reaction to the draft report, as well as talk to members of your Village staff and Trustees who may be attending the meeting. There will be copies of the Donohue report available for distribution at the meeting.
