HOVMSD FOG Control Program Update March 2016

Project Overview

The six businesses that will be required to install grease traps, based upon the guidelines approved at the February 2016 Commission Meeting, have been sent notification letters. Two sites (ET's Dog Pound and The Heiting Place) have called with questions. We have not heard back from the remaining four businesses.

The City of Kaukauna plumbing inspector was contacted by the plumber representing one of the six businesses and was told that we said it was ok to install the grease trap without taking out a permit. He declined to name the plumber or the business and I assured him that we have never insinuated that a business may bypass local or State regulations during the installation process. I did pass on the names of the four businesses in Kaukauna that will require installations by June so that his department can verify that the proper procedures are being followed.

Overview by Community

Darboy Sanitary District: A total of 5 sites require reminder letters and 2 will require site visits.

Village of Combined Locks: One site will require a reminder letter and no site visits are required.

Village of Kimberly: We finally were able to contact the owner of Hitters Bar and he assured us that he is cleaning his trap twice per month. We have recommended that the Village of Kimberly increase their inspections on the line around the Hitters lateral to verify that the grease is being contained on-site. A total of 7 sites require reminder letters and 1 will require a site visit.

Village of Little Chute: We have issued letters to The Heiting Place and Gentleman Jacks indicating that they will need to install grease traps by June, 2016. Bella Thai Café has a note on their door indicating that they are permanently closed. Two reminder letters will be sent and two site visits will be conducted.

City of Kaukauna: We have issued letters to ET's Dog Pound, Hillstreet Bar and Grill, Journey's Bar and K-Town Bar and Grill indicating that they will need to install grease traps at their facilities by June, 2016. A total of 3 sites require reminder letters and 2 sites require site visits.
