DECEMBER

- With the frigid conditions upon us, work on the Interceptor Rehabilitation Project has concluded for this season.

The crews achieved substantial progress over the past year, and the fifth and final phase of work was completed before weather brought work to a halt for the year. Changed conditions were encountered during construction along with groundwater intrusion on a few select manholes, making up a necessary phase 6. The phase 6 work will be fully evaluated after the current project has been closed out.






- After a successful and productive 2024 construction season, work is ramping up again for the Interceptor Rehabilitation Project. Check out the substantial progress that has been made so far!


