Hi Brian,

As we discussed, we are statutorily required to utilize the Kaukauna treasurer as the District treasurer (see below). The District is free to hire or contract with another person/entity to perform various accounting and bookkeeping duties. However, if the Commission decides to go that route, you should coordinate with the Kaukauna treasurer since they would be the one legally responsible as the treasurer.

Resolution No. 36 also appoints the Kaukauna deputy treasurer as the District's deputy treasurer. That is not statutorily required and could be rescinded.

Lastly, the statute is clear it is the District Commission that determines the amount of any compensation to be paid to the treasurer. That amount can be modified in the Commission's discretion.

Bill

Sec. 200.09(8), Wis. Stats.

(8) The treasurer of the city, village or town having the largest equalized valuation within the district shall act as treasurer of the district, shall receive such additional compensation therefor as the commission may determine, and shall at the expense of the district furnish such additional bond as the commission may require. Such treasurer shall keep all moneys of the district in a separate fund to be disposed of only upon order of the commission signed by the president and secretary.

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
